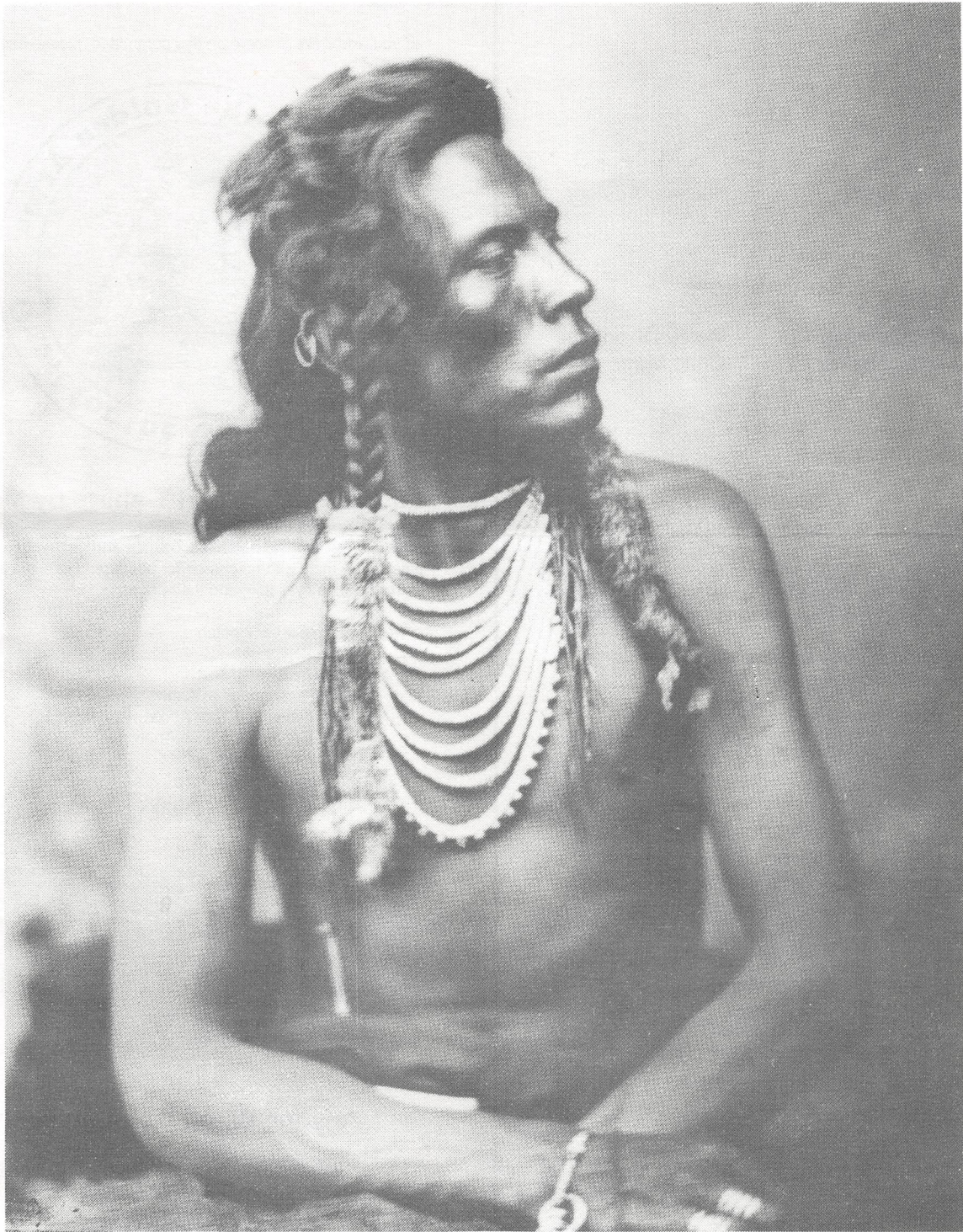

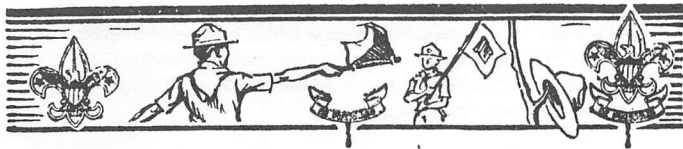

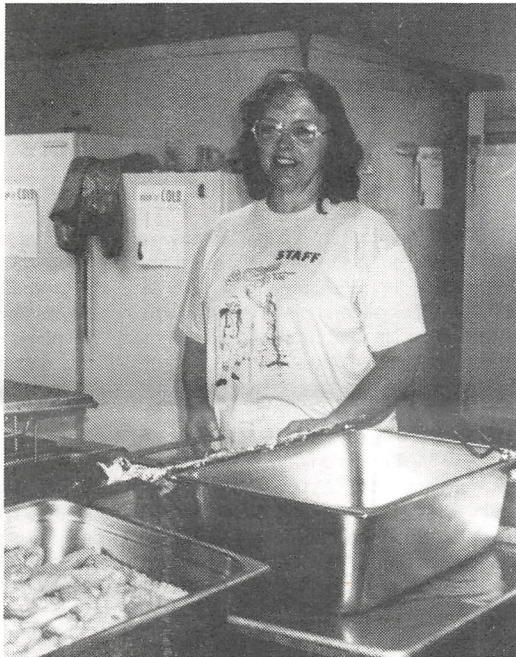
Fall Fellowship

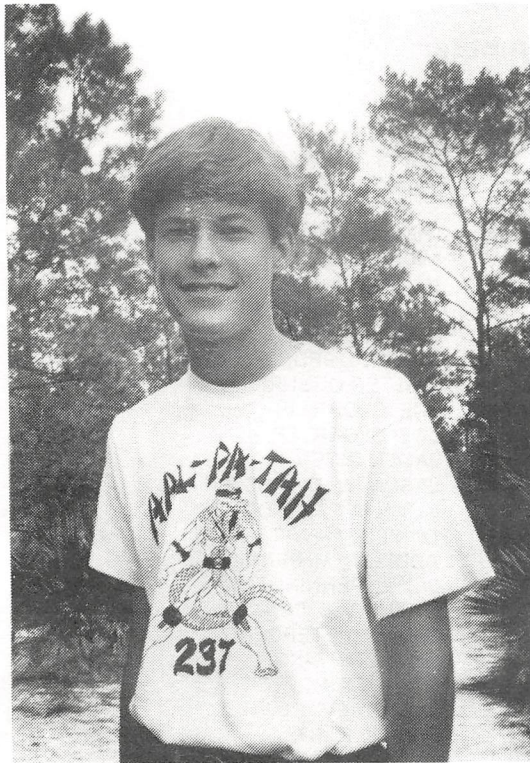

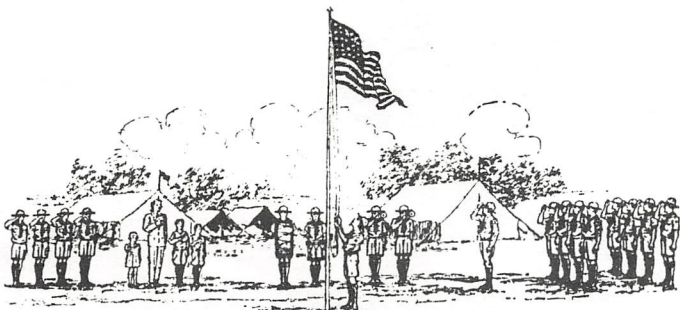
Ordeal Master, Dan Green, takes a breather from his busy schedule for a picture.

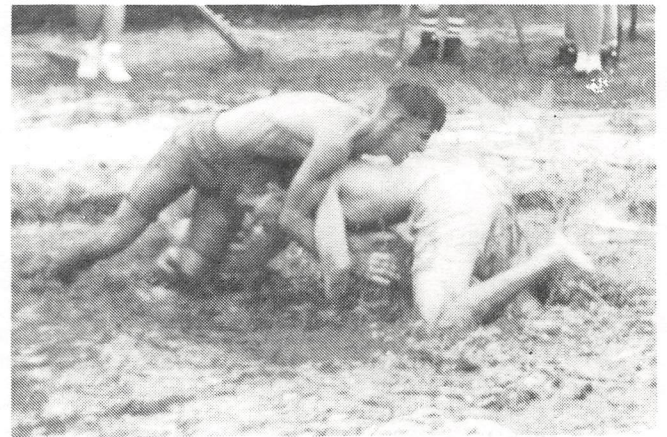


Harold Friend Elected 1993 Council President

- The president's eldest son is seven.

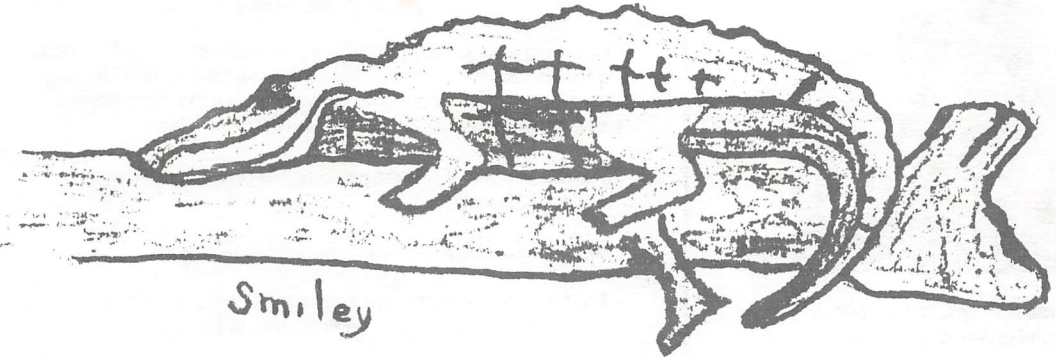
