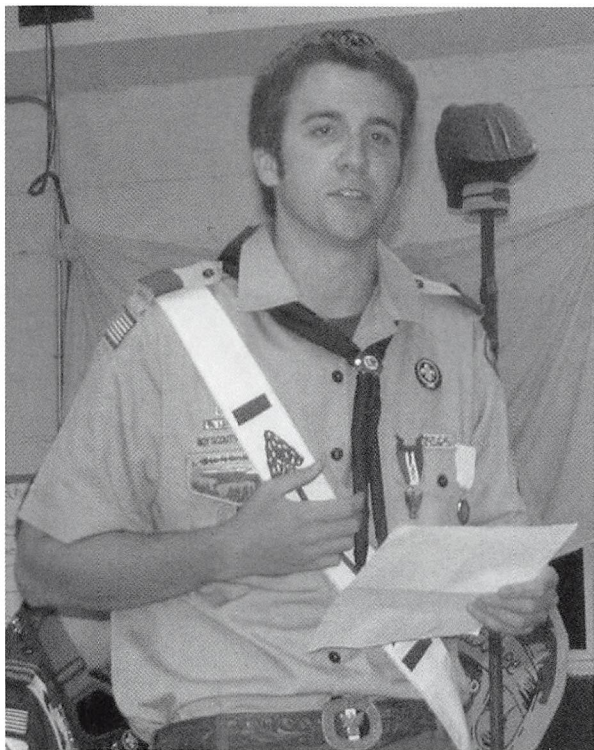

## LLDC

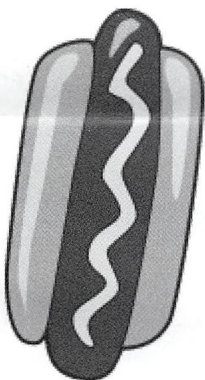

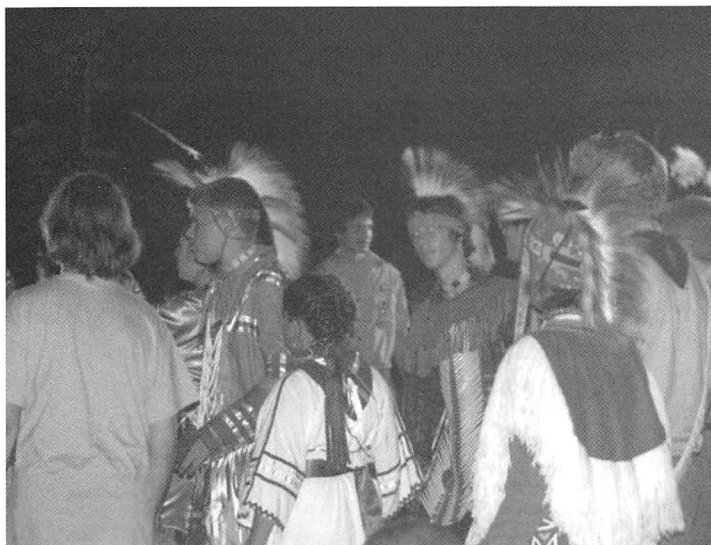
